Customs Department	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Photocopies of certificates of origin under certain free trade agreements are allowed to be used until 30 September 2021 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Forms E, D, AK, AJ, JTEPA, AI, Thai-India, AANZ, AHK, TC and Thai-Peru ○ Importers need prior approval from Customs to use a photocopy of the form ○ The original CO must be presented within 30–60 days • Extension of storage timelines for free zones, IEAT-free zones and bonded warehouses for a further year • Extension of timeline for re-exporting of temporary imported goods relating to personal use, exhibitions, repairing, samples, and equipment for research and development (under the Customs Tariff Decree Part 4 Category 3) for a further six months • Duty exemption on imported goods relating to the treatment of COVID-19 from 1 October 2020 onwards.
Excise Department	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Online submission is allowed for the suggested retail price form • Online submission is allowed for the waiver of excise tax for petroleum and lubricant products.
Department of Industrial Works	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Online submission is allowed for licensing requirements through one of the following channels: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Application through the hazardous substance single submission (HSSS) system and payment of fee via the e-payment channel ○ Application by email to RenewHazLicense@diw.mail.go.th and payment of fee via the e-payment channel with evidence thereof emailed to payment@diw.mail.go.th.
